Harun Mehmedinovic, Georgetown student will present his documentary about two Bosnians, one a Bosniak (Muslim) and the other a Serb, who sought refuge in the United States and in so doing rediscovered their common humanity. *'In the Name of the Son'* was nominated for an Oscar in the short films category.

A senior representative of the Bosnian diaspora community, in conjunction with the Washington-based Advocacy Project, will present the Srebrenica memorial quilt. The quilt is being made by survivors of the Srebrenica massacre to commemorate individual victims and keep the memory of the massacre alive.
